- LGEEPA (environmental impact studies)
- Social license? (ILO Convention 169)
- Environmental license (emissions/discharges/waste)
- Water use/rights (from CONAGUA)
- LFRA (Federal Law on Environmental Liability)

- Focus on oversight, regulation, and permitting of industrial safety and environmental protection in the hydrocarbon sector
- Sector activities include:
 - oil and gas E&P

 - retail


ASEA TODAY: WORK IN PROGRESS...

- Budget has been cut 50%
- Functions mostly performed at former agency offices
- Unclear where documents should be submitted
- Working group developing new shale gas/hydraulic fracturing regulations has been put on hold



SHALE GAS E&P IN MORE DEVELOPED AREAS


